A BILL FOR AN ACT CONCERNING THE RIGHT OF COLORADANS TO HUNT WILDLIFE, AND, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, ESTABLISHING HUNTING AS THE PRIMARY MEANS OF MANAGING WILDLIFE.

Bill Summary

The bill clarifies that the people have the right to hunt, fish, and harvest wildlife and also establishes public hunting and fishing as the primary means to manage wildlife in the state of Colorado.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 33-1-101, amend (4): 3 and **add** (1.5) as follows: 4 **33-1-101. Legislative declaration.** (1.5) IN ORDER TO PRESERVE 5 COLORADO'S HUNTING AND FISHING HERITAGE, THE PEOPLE WILL ALWAYS 6 HAVE THE RIGHT TO HUNT, FISH, AND HARVEST WILDLIFE. THIS RIGHT DOES 7 NOT ALLOW TRESPASSING ON PRIVATE PROPERTY; AFFECT WATER RIGHTS; 8 PREVENT THE PARKS AND WILDLIFE COMMISSION, OR A HEARING OFFICER 9 WITH AUTHORITY DELEGATED BY THE PARKS AND WILDLIFE COMMISSION, 10 FROM SUSPENDING OR REVOKING AN INDIVIDUAL'S HUNTING, FISHING, OR 11 GAME-HARVESTING LICENSE; OR DIMINISH OTHER PRIVATE RIGHTS. 12 (4) The IN ORDER TO PRESERVE THE HERITAGE, TRADITIONS, AND 13 CULTURE OF WILDLIFE CONSERVATION, THE state shall utilize USE PUBLIC 14 hunting, trapping, and fishing as the primary methods of effecting 15 necessary wildlife harvests CONTROLLING AND MANAGING WILDLIFE. 16 **SECTION 2.** Act subject to petition - effective date. This act 17 takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the 18 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August 19 10, 2016, if adjournment sine die is on May 11, 2016); except that, if a 20 referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the 21 state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act 22 within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect 23 unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in 24 November 2016 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the 25 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
