  - a. Senate Bill S11-06 Allocating funds for the 4<sup>th</sup> Annual Rabies Symposium
- III. Open Forum
  - a. Associate Dean William Graves Dean of the Graduate College
    - i. There are no plans currently to cut graduate programs
    - ii. It is a very involved process to cut graduate programs
    - iii. 113 Graduate majors currently and 37 certificate programs
    - iv. We have gained more graduate programs in the last decade then we have lost
    - v. We are developing a process to evaluate inter-departmental majors we would welcome feedback
    - vi. Smith Example would be elimination of History of Science and Technology major; how can graduate students be more involved? I can come as often as you need to come update you on this issue
    - vii. Looking at overview of graduate programs similar to one performed at University of Iowa last year
    - viii. Gross GRST 633 Will now be charged FICA (social security) 5.65% about \$90mo
      - 1. Graves we didn't realize this would be the case you will no longer be considered a student and exemption from FICA will disappear; Dean Holger has said by early this fall we will have a plan in place to take care of this by next summer; different colleges are looking at different ways to cover this (eg, a small summer raise to cover this)
    - ix. Woolcock this arises because we are getting no credit couldn't we get research credit for the class
      - 1. Graves you can't receive credit without tuition
    - x. Kirk What is limit to not have to pay FICA?
      - 1. ¾ time, but not beyond that

- xi. K. Ament Difference in fees between being registered and not?
  - 1. No
- xii. Kramer Can't take this if you are graduating?
  - 1. No, not if you are defending
- xiii. Fateh as much as ¾ time in summer?
  - 1. Yes
- xiv. Russel How does this affect student loans?
  - 1. Lott 633 will be treated like internship and so loans will still be able to be obtained and deferred
- xv. Gross how does it work with NSF grants?
  - 1. I'll look into that
- xvi. Kemmet Graduation ceremony
  - 1. Registrar's office is in charge of graduation ceremony; rising concern with the number of students at graduation at CY Stephens; guests were limited to 6; if you can reasonably limit guests to 6, that would be appreciated, there will be no enforcement; it was a friendly request; there won't be any ticketing; we don't know happens if they meet capacity; ask our guests to sit close together don't create a lot of single, empty seats
