29		21st. There will be games, interaction with the kids. It's a big socialized event and		
30		for a great cause.

32		go to webpage, hit register and signup, it is an easy process. Morale captain to		
33		answer questions, enough time to raise money.

36	IV.	Senate Forum		
37		a. Senator Yeninas – On behalf of Physics department, he is currently 5th		
38		year PhD student now, there was salary increase in the department once. Among		
39		the top 100 1st tier departments, they dropped to position 94. Requesting for		
10		stipend increases, but have met with resistance from the chair and Ames Lab		
11		Head of the Department. Believes this is a reasonable request. Craig Ogilvie is on		
12		their side, assimilated last 6 years' worth of data. He also got data from the AI		
13		Handbook for Physics and compared among the top 100 fellow land grant		
14		universities, the other big XII, regent schools. However there are

1		interdepartmental programs with the Physics department, other stem programs,
2		AMES lab departments, and other NSF depts. – there is no easy way to get the
3		overall information related to salary. He wants to pass around a page, where he
4		requested interested senators to write their department name, write the main
5		source of funding, TA/RA monthly stipend before taxes. He will also go to
6		Shelley Lott for more information. Final Comment is that \$50 increase for over 5
7		years was definitely not at parity with other life increases.
8		b. Open to questions:
9		i. CIO Sarkar – Only Physics or other departments involved also?
10		NOT really, as of yet, only dealing with Physics dept. However, Craig wants to
11		ensure that all students get fair share, there is an annual pay increase for inflation
12		for professors, not for students. Food services get 3.5% increase, but not students
13		– this is an irking issue.
14		ii. President Smith – This can't really be a joint effort, if it gets big,
15		joint effort would be very difficult, if anyone feels that something needs to be
16		done about their salary, they should look at peer institutions, then pursue it, but
17		joint coalition might not be very helpful. Also, the salary varies from program to
18		program, and also from funding sources – so begin by asking department chair,
19		graduate person in charge, etc.
20		iii. Treasurer Gross – within a time period, there was pay freeze,
21		important to make sure the source of the data. However looking at the general
22		trend, \$1500-1700 vs. \$1700-3100 per month is widely disparate.
23

25		a. Report of the President - President Smith
26		i. Elaine from Ombuds office had come last year to give a small
27		presentation to GPSS, the Ombuds office helps in addressing conflicts between
28		different people on campus, and she presented the 2011 year short snapshot about
29		how its resources were used. (ask for details from Erica)
30		ii. The MU has some new facilities, a bill was passed to fund
31		renovations, make it more handicap friendly [few door comes out and hits you],
32		GSB put further money, improve ramps, Bowling alley is being removed, the
33		space for pool tables is being redesigned and will make room for more seating to
34		accommodate overflow for lunch hours – this issue will go to GSB before any
35		final decision is made. Investigation is being done so as to what to do with the
36		MU hotel (4th-6th floors), looking at all possible ways, it is outdated, how to
37		remodel, nothings definitive, couple of committees are formed, there is exchange
38		of information now.
39		iii. Green roof, it is a GSB issue – ask Senator at Large Smazal for
40		more details.

Anderson – why is overflow an issue? PLAN is to get rid of

2 3 4 5	The purpose and intention of the Graduate and Professional Student Senate (GPSS) is to advocate the needs for a successful graduate student and to ensure that the policies and initiatives being set forth at the University are benefiting to the graduate student body. We are calling for proposals to improve graduate student success and overall experience.
6 7 8 9 10	GPSS receives part of each graduate student's activity fee in order to support our purpose and intention as a senate. Using a portion of these collected funds, proposals will be funded for a maximum of \$2000 to start up a proposed plan. Thereafter the proposed plans need to be self-sustaining by either generating funds for continued operation or through other continuing supporting sources.
11 12 13 14 15	Proposals must come from an established graduate student organization, or will apply for student organization recognition by Fall 2012 (http://www.sac.iastate.edu/en/clubs_and_organizations/). Additionally a statement of support for the proposal from the DOGE or department representative /program sponsor is required. Proposals supporting or complementing existing department / program initiatives are encouraged, however not required.
16 17 18 19 20 21 22 23	Proposals need a clearly defined problem and solution. Describe the problem thoroughly, including severity of need and urgency, while providing any applicable comparisons to other departments, programs and/or universities. Solution steps should be reasonable and articulate a well thought out process with timeline to reaching the stated goal(s) while justifying all line-item expenses in the budget. Include the estimated number of graduate and professional students impacted by the proposal, as well as the methodology of how that number was arrived at. Provide evaluation metrics on how impact and success will be measured. Give reasonable justification of why success / results are expected.
24 25 26 27 28 29	All proposals will be evaluated by the GPSS Proposal Exploration Committee and the committee's recommendations on at most ten (10) proposals will be passed to GPSS. Proposals without a detailed budget of line-item expenses and funding sources will not be considered. Additionally proposals not adhering to the five (5) page, 12pt font, 1.5 line-spaced limit (including the budget, but not including the ONE required proposal support letter) will not be considered. Funding, if any, will ultimately be put up to vote for the entire GPSS body.
