#### III. Report of the Treasurer

- i. Finance Committee needs members!
  - a. The Finance Committee (FC) is a standing committee chaired by the Treasurer, and is responsible for the evaluation of all legislation and GPSS policy with financial, fiscal or monetary implications.
  - b. FC has five main responsibilities:
    - 1. Analyze the financial, fiscal and monetary components of legislation and other items brought before GPSS and then present our findings to the Senate.
    - 2. Prepare the budget for the next fiscal year and present this for Senate approval via formal legislation.
    - 3. Evaluate and revise, as necessary, the official guidelines governing the Regular Allocations and Special Allocations processes for GPSS.
    - 4. Evaluate requests for Regular Allocations by Student Organizations during each of two yearly allocations cycles, and recommend to the Senate final allocations through formal legislation.
    - 5. As necessary, evaluate requests for Special Allocations requested of the Senate.
