PRESIDENT

- 1) Thank you everyone for coming to President Wintersteen's listening session. It is a good opportunity to start the conversation and raise our issues. I had a follow up meeting with her and she said she will be looking in to the funding opportunities in the future to support the graduate students.
 - She has forwarded the meeting notes with Provost and Dean of Graduate college, will be following up on several of the tasks.
- 2) I spoke with Dean Graves regarding the issue of minimum stipend. He mentioned that based on the new change in workday and upon consultation with fiscal people in Beardshear, he took the decision to not increase the minimum. However, he said, the graduate college encourages PIs and department to implement the increase if possible for graduate students.
- 3) As most of you heard, the state of Iowa proposed midyear 10.9 million dollars permanent reduction Board of Regents (BoR) allocation is likely to affect ISU and University of Iowa. During my discussions, I do not see any direct impact of graduate and professional students. However, the BoR will consider the tuition increase April meeting.

- 5) The New Student Onboarding Committee was formed to systematically look at what the institution can do to improve the success and ease with which new students are 'onboarded' to the university. The group is defining the 'onboarding' time as from when you get the offer letter from the department through your first year at Iowa State. As a part of this work, there is a subcommittee that is proposing the development of a 'digital repository and portal.' The goal of the repository and portal is to provide a single point of contact/web presence with links for many of the items new students need to know to successfully transition/onboard to Iowa State. The portal would serve as a one-stop virtual location to find information to successfully acclimate students to Iowa State. As a part of developing our proposal, the committee wants to hear from graduate and/or professional students their ideas on critical portal content and functionality. - 1) The number of graduate and professional students dropped for spring 2018 based on our income.
 - o Current population: 3,720
 - o Deficit in projected income from previous Treasurer: ~\$10,000
 - o Deficit from projected pessimistic scenario (modified last month): ~\$5,000
- 2) The Finance Committee evaluated 22 requests for Spring Regular Allocations.
 - o Total requested: \$20,684.00
 - o Number of Graduate and Professional Organizations approved: 20
 - o Total granted: **\$12,997.23**
- 3) It was very challenging for the Finance Committee to work on the projected Budget for the Fiscal Year 2019.
 - o Pessimistic scenario, considering 3,500 graduate and professional students.
 - o Cuts for monthly PAG, Wakonse, R/T/L Awards, Regular Allocations, Special Allocations, Social events, Research conference, and NAGPS.
 - o More details in the Budget bill.

GPSS OFFICER REPORT MARCH 2018

SG GRADUATE COLLEGE SENATORS

- 1) Resolution for Student Fee Increase from \$36.75 to \$39.25 has been passed and has been forwarded to SSFTC for approval on the following premises:
 - a. There has not been an increase in the Student Activity Fee for many years despite increases in prices due to inflation, and increases in need of the expanding base of student organizations; and Student Government has had to cut funding from student organization's budgets due to having insufficient funding for the student's need and will have to cut more at current demand levels; and the Graduate and Professional Student Senate has also met demand for their funding services beyond their supply; and one of the chief marketing points that draws students to Iowa State University has, for many years, been its broad base of student organizations of all sorts; and the University, and the students attending, value the availability of student organizations and the ease with which they can pursue their passions and share them with each other, due to the availability of funding through Student Government. Therefore, the Student Government recommended a Student Activity Fee increase of \$2.50 so that the semester fee changes from \$36.75 to \$39.25.
- 2) Articles of Cooperation revised between the Student Government and the GPSS:
 - a. The SG shall receive 1/3 and the GPSS shall receive 2/3 of the Student Activity Fees paid by graduate and professional students after FY 2022.
- 3) Iowa State Out of the Darkness Walk
 - a. Our campus altogether has raised an astounding \$41,371, which makes Iowa State the biggest donor in the nation to this amazing cause and since all donations were to be doubled, so we effectively raised around \$82,742.
